Duration: 2014-2020

Budget: EUR 96 million



- Managing Authority: France
- Monitoring Committee composed by MS/PS and Commission
- ◆ Target: Decision makers and practitioners in the cities


Integrated + Participative + Transnational Exchange + Expertise = 'hands on' Sustainable Urban Development

- Integrated approach > tackling different policy areas and governance levels at the same time
- Participative approach > involving all local stakeholders
- Transnational exchange > learning from peers
- Expertise > customised support provided to all networks











3 main strands of activities



TRANSNATIONAL NETWORKS



Exchange and learning among cities - sharing experiences (problems, solutions), identify good practices to design & implement integrated urban policies

CAPACITY BUILDING



Enhancing the capacities of urban practitioners and policy-makers to develop integrated and participatory approaches to urban development

CAPITALISATION COMMUNICATION



Communicating urban knowledge, policy recommendations, good practices to a wider audience of policymakers & practitioners



Who is eligible?





- ✓ Cities, municipalities, towns
- ✓ Infra-municipal tiers of government
- ✓ Metropolitan Authorities and organised agglomerations
- ✓ Local agencies defined as equivalent public organisations set up by a city*



- ✓ Provincial, regional and national authorities, as far as urban issues are concerned
- ✓ Universities and research centres, as far as urban issues are concerned

Thematic Coverage

URBACT III covers the following **Thematic Objectives**:

- ✓ Strengthening research, technological development and innovation (TO1)
- ✓ Enhancing access to and use and quality of ICT (TO2)
- ✓ Enhancing the competitiveness of SMEs (TO3)
- ✓ Supporting the shift towards a low carbon economy in all sectors
 (TO4)
- ✓ Promoting climate change adaptation, risk prevention and management (TO5)
- ✓ Protecting the environment and promoting resource efficiency (TO6)
- ✓ Promoting sustainable transport and removing bottlenecks in key network infrastructures (TO7)
- ✓ Promoting employment and supporting labour mobility (TO8)
- ✓ Promoting social inclusion and combating poverty (TO9)
- ✓ Investing in education, skills and lifelong learning by developing education and training infrastructure (TO10)

Partnership



- ◆ Partnership proposed for Phase 1 should comprise up to 7 to 10 cities: 1 Lead Partner + 6 to 9 network Partners
- Partnerships shall respect the following rules:
- ✓ The partnership may include 2 "non-city partners" maximum (as defined under section 2.2);
- ✓ A beneficiary (city and non-city partners) may not be partner in more than two
 approved Action Planning Networks at a time;
- ✓ A city can be Lead Partner of one Action Planning Network only;
- ✓ Non-written rule: North-South & East-West geographical coverage and balance
- A balance of cities from EU regions is necessary as follows:
- ✓ a minimum of 3 cities from Less Developed regions where the total number of partner cities is 7;
- ✓ a minimum of 4 cities from Less Developed regions where the total number of partner cities is 8 to 9 partners.
- ✓ a minimum of 5 cities from Less Developed regions where the total number of partner cities is 10 partners.




The Terms of Reference and the Guide are the main support documents to build a successful network proposal





The learning Process







Financial resources



◆ The total maximum budget of an Action Planning Network will be up to EUR 750 000 (Phases 1 and 2)



◆ The total eligible cost for Phase 1 of an Action Planning Network is a maximum of EUR 150 000.

The European Regional Development Fund (ERDF) co-financing rates*:

Cities in more developed regions	70%
Cities in less developed/ transition regions	85%
Swiss partners	50%
Norwegian partners may participate at their own cost

- Expertise budget is EUR 127 500* (for both Phases)
- ✓ equals 170 days of expertise (40 days in Phase 1)



How to find Lead Experts?





- URBACT database of validated experts with nearly 230 validated Lead experts > LINK
- You can invite experts you know to apply to our open call for the pool of validated experts > here
- They can come to you!
 - > You should signal this @Partner Search Tool > LINK



Selection of the Lead expert...



Phase 1 – the Lead expert (40 days)
Supports the network with all Phase 1 activities (notably the Baseline Study)



- > At least one of the three proposed Lead expert should be female!
- > All experts need to sign the letter of intent (template in ToR). Start the search process early.



- Assessment panel will make recommendations for appointing the "right" expert for phase 1
 - > Check the Guide for tips on choosing the right expert profile and selection procedure

Phase 2 – Lead Expert and Ad hoc Experts (130 days):

- ✓ The same Lead Expert in phase 1 can be proposed as Lead Expert in phase 2 if the performance was positive
- ✓ All networks in Phase 2 can have (x number) Ad hoc Experts in addition to the Lead expert





Keep in mind...



A city can be a Lead Partner in only one APN proposal



- A city can be a Project Partner in only two approved APN
 check multiple commitments
- The <u>right mix</u> of partners coming from less/more developed regions > check the <u>MAP</u>
- Proposals with newcomer cities will be rewarded due to assessment criteria
 - > consult the ToR for further information
 - > The list of URBACT II and URBACT III beneficiaries is available <u>here</u>
- Make sure the partnership is coherent (including the geographical coverage*)
 - > The Guide provides useful information





All changes are directly linked to:

- ✓ The results of the closure evaluation where all 205
 APN cities responded
- ✓ The results of the Lead Expert Questionnaire
- ✓ The experience gained with Implementation Networks and Transfer Networks
- ✓ IAP study* will give as further intelligence for designing the Phase 2 learning journey



Main Features (1)



- Eligible Beneficiaries no change from previous calls (city partners now including agencies and non-city partners as defined in the URBACT programme documents)
- ◆ Thematic Coverage no change all 10 Thematic Objectives are covered. The ToR include an overview of thematic coverage to date for both TO and Urban Agenda for EU.
- ◆ Partnership <u>CHANGE</u> to between 7-10 partner cities immediately in Phase 1. Lesson from APN call 1 closure reports.
- ◆ Partnership no change to balance between more and less developed regions.
- ◆ Lead Partner CHANGE LP can only be candidate in ONE network and must be a city as defined in the ToR.
- Project Partners no change can be partner in 2 approved networks (but problem of multiple commitments emphasized in the guide) + Newcomers part of the assessment criteria



Main Features (2)




- ◆ Network Duration no change to proposed duration of 6 months plus 24 months in Phase 2. Call 1 beneficiaries considered this duration to be correct.
- **Budget** no change maximum budget 750.000€
- ◆ Activities CHANGE a possibility to undertake <u>small scale actions</u> from the Integrated Action Plan during Phase 2. Lesson from APN call 1 where this was done in some projects with positive results.
- Expertise CHANGE three experts will be proposed in the Phase 1 applications form using the model already tested in Transfer Networks. This model will be improved by adding an interview with the expert recommended by the EAP.
- Expertise <u>CHANGE</u> minimum of one <u>female expert</u> to be proposed.
- Expertise <u>CHANGE</u> evaluation of the experts work between Phase 1 and Phase 2



How to draft the proposal?





▲ Layout of the application form and the criteria are available in the Terms of Reference of the call

- All the aspects for building a successful proposal are set out in the Guide
- ✓ including explanation of all Phase 1 activities (organised within two work packages)
- ✓ Including all hints and tips for coherent project proposal presented in different sections of the application form



Submission procedure



To submit a network proposal, applicants shall complete two steps:



- Complete and submit their Phase 1 Application through Synergie-CTE in English. Only applications submitted using Synergie-CTE will be accepted.
 - ✓ Detailed information on how to create and submit a Phase 1 Application through the online system Synergie-CTE is provided in the <u>Practical guide to SYNERGIE</u> application.

The deadline for the online submission of the Phase 1 Applications is 17 April 2019, 15.00 CET.

The email shall be received no later than 18 April 2019, 15.00 CET.



Assessment process





- Assessment of Action Planning Network proposals will be carried out by the External Assessment panel based on the assessment criteria
- Approval by the Monitoring Committee 26 June 2019
- > Formal starting date of Phase 1 is 2 September 2019
