Improvement in collection and treatment helps reducing pollution

Published the new EU Commision report on the implementation of the Urban Waste Water Treatment Directive, showing that 95% of waste water in the EU is collected and 88% is biologically treated. While the trend is positive, there is still work to do – 1% of urban wastewater is still not collected and over 6% is not sufficiently well treated to meet secondary biological treatment standards. The current level of investments in many Member States is too low to reach and maintain compliance with the Directive in the long term, with several EU towns or cities still needing to build or modernise their infrastructure for collecting waste water, as well as to put modern treatment plants in place. Going with the flow!

An EU-funded DP Renewables project (completed this March) is commercialising two hydrokinetic turbines (25 kW and 60 kW), which involves an emerging technology that generates electricity from the kinetic energy in flowing water, picked up from waves, tides or currents.
