2021, A year to improve our good practices

We finally leave the unfortunate 2020 behind, to look forward to a new year in which we can improve social awareness, ecological practices, efficient waste management, and put the circular economy more and more in the spotlight.

While we wait for the first third of the year to launch the platform in Guimarães and Opole, in recent weeks you have seen some interesting data from the 3 URBACT cities that already have their Tropa Verde in operation on our social networks:

- Santiago reached 4000 users in just 5 years, getting 29 recycling points located throughout the city. In this time more than 14000 checks have already been issued.
- In the first three months of service in Pavlos Melas, were already obtained 13,000 registered aluminum boxes (176 kg), 27,500 plastic bottles (690 Kg), 178 kg of paper and 200 liters of oil for frying were collected separately, through the participation of 400 registered citizens and 40 sponsors. In addition, the municipality will have an educational mobile green point in early 2021 to raise awareness among youth about recycling actions.

European green deal for sustainable batteries
