Tips for the Local Support Group

- Participants have to benefit from participation
- Be clear about the role of the LSG
- Do not involve more than 15 people in the core group
- Do not duplicate structures and tasks; establish durable structures
- Have a neutral moderator
- Think about the involvement of the Managing Authority

What can be activities of the Local Support Group?

- · Taking part in the design and implementation of the LAP
- · Having periodic meetings
- Receiving reports from the city representatives; reporting back to their groups
- · Supporting the elaboration and validation of cases studies
- · Mobilising the public, political and institutional support
- Organising local dissemination events and obtaining media coverage
- Testing certain recommendations from the network
- Commenting on final outputs
- one-day coaching or training sessions by the network
