


Objective of the Baseline Study

Results of the Baseline Study

Overview about the historic urban landscapes in the partner towns

- Historic urban areas size from 0.2 3.5 km²
- Population from 2,000 20,000 inhabitants
- Historic urban landscapes of Baroque, Gothic, Romanesque and Renaissance styles; some with well integrated new architecture
