

HerO Project Meeting in Liverpool

16th - 17th July 2009



Objective

The Project Meeting in Liverpool is the 3rd Thematic Seminar during Phase II of the network HerO - Heritage as Opportunity. Building up on the results of the meetings in Poitiers and Graz, this conference aims to foster the exchange among the project partners in view of supporting the elaboration processes of the Cultural Heritage Integrated Management Plans (CHIMPs) on local level in the partner cities.

Thus, a special focus will be on the project partner's presentations of their 'Road Maps' (Draft Local Action Plans) describing their approaches to elaborate their CHIMPs. In a "Peer Review" the partners' 'Road Maps' will be discussed in the plenum as well as in smaller groups and all partners will receive feedback on their proposals.

While elaborating the draft programme we endeavoured to take into account your suggestions given in the satisfaction surveys: we tried to schedule more time for excursions and for the hosting city to present relevant local projects to the HerO Partners. Furthermore, we will hold a special session on UNESCO World Heritage during the conference as this has been desired by some partners, too.

Last but not least, the project meeting in Liverpool will of course also provide a platform to discuss organizational and administrative issues, communication strategies and finances.
