# Liverpool

- **Liverpool 2024 – a thriving international city** : sustainable community strategy.
- key aligned plans / strategies - **Local Development Framework**, including a Local Development scheme, which was subject to a UK **Sustainability Appraisal** (*20 national criteria*). The specific assessment tool of Liverpool was adapted from the SA
- **Local Area Agreement (LAA)**: a three-year contract between government and local authority, which state how key priorities of local people are delivered within their neighborhoods.
- Set of **indicators** divided in many parts (contextual, Core output, housing strategy, local output)

- Liverpool 2024 – a thriving international city
  - A city vision focused on 5 key drivers for change
    - Competitiveness
    - Connectivity
    - Distinctive Sense of Place
    - Thriving Neighborhoods
    - Health and Wellbeing
  - Contains 12 outcomes, which all relate to improving the lives of every citizen



## Distinctive Sense of Place

We'll know when we've  
achieved the vision when  
Liverpool will be:

Distinctive from our overseas  
competitors, harnessing the diversity  
and creativity of our people, cultural  
assets and physical fabric

- **Local Development Framework (LDF)**
  - The Core spatial Strategy / a critically important long term document defining the vision and implementation of local physical development
- **Sustainability Appraisal**
  - All development plan documents must be subject to the UK Sustainability Appraisal
  - a way of assessing the social, environmental and economic effects of the policies and proposals
  - a way to help & show how and why policies have been prepared: / More sustainable plans
  - Based on 18 to 20 national criteria
  - Example of city application : the Liverpool Integrated Appraisal Toolkit (assessment based on the 5 pillars of the city vision)
  - Implication of citizens and stakeholders (commission)

# Performance indicators

## Local Area Agreement (LAA):

- a three-year contract between government and local authority, key priorities for local people are delivered within their neighborhoods
- an easy-to-reference view of which the indicators priority measure the five drivers
- To show the targets and which partner is responsible for reporting performance and delivery
- **Each indicator refers to the relevant chapter of the Sustainable Community Strategy**, where all aligned partner plans and strategies are also detailed. This shows how the vision will be delivered within each partner organization

# Monitoring assessment tools

## Sustainable Development Criteria – Grid Assessment

### Goals :

- sustainability assessment of projects or policies
- criteria : “audit point” or impact on several themes
- Balanced approach between all criteria in one axis

### Notation :

- Based on main questions (and detailed on supplementary one)
- Positive, negative or neutral impact
- An average score per axis on the basis of the notation

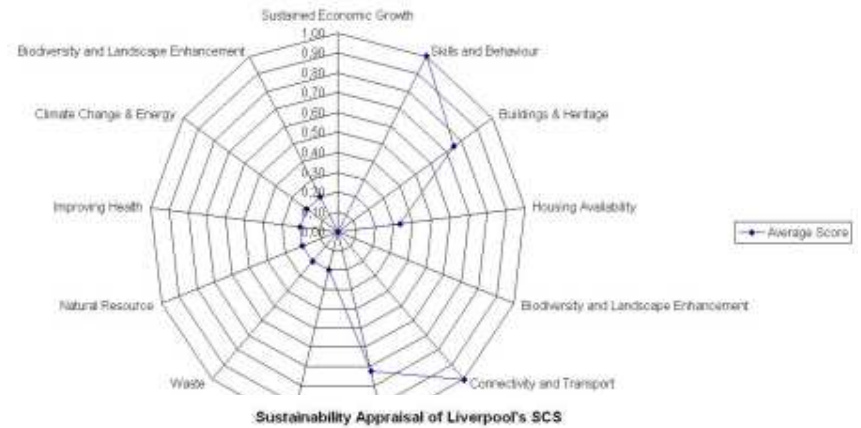

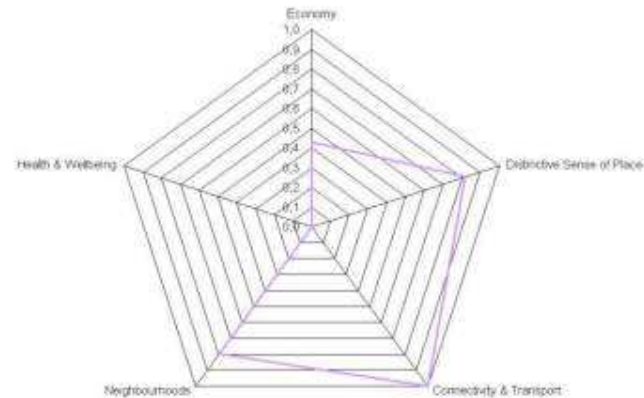


# Liverpool Assessment tool :
