Malmö's Overview Plan 2005

Malmö's overall vision:

- > serve as an attractive city for residents, businesses and visitors.
- become an important part of the Öresund region (between Denmark and Sweden),
- European and global city with strong networks and learning,
- a city that focuses on knowledge and education,
- a city that supports stable employment and business innovation,
- > ecologically appropriate housing in an overall clean and healthy environment,
- rich with recreational opportunities.
- Part 1: Timeline for Municipal Decisions
- Part 2: Updates to the plan and modifications since the Master Plan of 2000
- Part 3: Strategies and guidance for implementation.
- **Specific goals in the plan include**: city-district strategies / collective and individual welfare / attractiveness and sustainability / land / goals concerning accommodation and housing, business and jobs, green spaces, traffic and environment and risk factors.





- 11 target areas
- Participation and interaction in society
- Economic and social issues (Including education levels, income level, unemployment, etc)
- Living and growing conditions for children and young people (including access to high schools, quality of preschools through high schools, academic testing, living conditions, etc)
- The work environment and health at work
- > Environment and products (Including safety, regulations, etc)
- Health promotion and health care access
- Protection against contamination
- Sexuality and reproductive health
- Physical activity
- > Eating habits and food
- > Tobacco, alcohol, drugs, doping and gambling










Malmö's Welfare Accounting System The Spider-web diagram: Comparison of women and girls in Malmö centre in the different target areas
