




TTR – (First) representatives of NRW







- The established working groups are responsible for the development of an annual program & to answer the remaining questions







General approach & financing

- **Set-up**: As a regional initiative TTR ELAt is carried out by regional partners, accompanied & supported by political representatives
- Basic financing: Basic activities of TTR ELAt covered by contributions of 25,000 € per partner & year (2010 2013) provided by the provinces/NRW-ministeries
- Additional funding: To execute concrete projects based on the program other independent funding sources (e.g. INTERREG IV/V, Objective 2, FP7/8) have to be found



Working groups (I)

Main targets & tasks so far are:

- Work-out joint action program
- Act on operational level
- Develop an annual action plan
- Carry-out at least one important activity/project per year

Working groups foreseen as a "growth model" (i.e. could be expanded to a joint TTR ELAt-bureau)





Working groups (II)

- Working group "Economy" supervises program lines (1) strategic networking, (2) business development support, (4) brains & (5) entrepreneurship At least foreseen members: RDAs, universities, business networks, campus/companies
- Working group "Institutional framework conditions" supervises program lines (3) institutional development as well as (6) lobbying & marketing At least foreseen members: Government, mayor cities

First conclusions & benefits





TTR ELAt – First conclusions & benefits

- Desired West-orientation of Northrhine-Westphalia and Eastorientation of the Benelux countries ("Gateway to ...") will be expanded in economic & technological respect
- 2. Trinational interlinkage of insufficiently connected regions so far opens up new opportunities to close gaps in the regional value-chains, to create more critical mass & to strengthen the visibility on European scale
- 3. The **focussed** (only three promising fields) & at the same time **strategic approach** (combining contentwise & framework condition-related activities) **is new** & probably **opens up better chances for successful results**





TTR ELAt – First conclusions & benefits

- 4. The regional & project-oriented approach of the TTR ELAt-initiative could lead to **very practical & demand-oriented cooperations**, but assumes also a stronger interlinkage between regional strategies & funding opportunities
- 5. Cross-border business will be supported especially in the field of technology-oriented SMEs & by **building up cooperate networks between companies** (& R&D/ university institutes)
- 6. Border-related **structural barriers & problems** (e.g. in terms of funding instruments) **will be tackled strategically**; their solution will **strengthen the leading role of the regions in cross-border development** within the EU
