






- Promotion of **integrated** urban development approaches co-ordinating the different sectors

1995 bis 1998






Monitoring-system: Vacancy rates of flats in Leipzig







- Sectoral structure of the city-administration. Every sector has its own objectives and priorities.


Current tasks
