








After two years and half of intense work, exchange and learning the Arrival Cities Project arrived to its end. In the last four months our Network Partners' Integrated Action Plans received the approval by the political elected representatives and were presented to the citizens and local stakeholders during a series of signing off events which took place at local level. At Network level, we celebrated the closure of the project with a Final Conference which took place on the 24th of April in the premises of the Committee of the Regions in Brussels and seen the presence of over 100 participants. We are eager to have been the sole network in fostering the exchange of knowledge and learning on a topic that is one of the main challenges for our cities, and we hope to have given a contribution in finding alternatives and sustainable solutions to the management of migrant flows; solutions that take into account the new comers as well as the migrants that are already integrated in our cities.
