What is an URBACT network?

URBACT offers cities a unique opportunity to collaborate through European networks for exchange and learning. Combining local participation with peer learning, cities co-create and implement new and improved local strategies for sustainable urban development.

Driving change for better cities

With EUR 96,3 million in funding, URBACT III (2014-2020) is organised around four main objectives:

- · Capacity for policy delivery
- Policy design
- Policy implementation
- · Building and sharing knowledge

The main beneficiaries are municipalities, towns (without limit of size), infra-municipal tiers of government, metropolitan authorities, organised agglomerations and local agencies. Regional and national authorities, universities and research centers can participate as non-city partners.



Action Planning Networks

URBACT's strategic focus is to strengthen local capacities on integrated and sustainable urban development, notably using **Action Planning Networks**.

These networks are expected to support an organised process of exchange and learning among cities across Europe, with a view to improving local policies through concrete action planning. Having identified a policy challenge to address, each city has worked with local stakeholders and exchanged with European peers to develop an Integrated Action Plan. This roadmap ensures a series of integrated and operational steps to overcome the challenge.


